OUR DAILY CALLS



A family that travels in their camper doing temporary work called PFP because their dog was near-death. No veterinarians would help them without an up-front deposit which they didn't have. The couple and their children were distraught and didn't know where to turn. PFP was able to arrange for a home veterinary visit to quietly and respectfully help their dog over the rainbow bridge.

A multi-generation family living together needed assistance getting their cats Felix and Milo neutered to prevent a litter of kittens.

We assisted several owners with pet issues ranging from gastrointestinal, a bad shoulder, ear infections, wounds, and sadly even a few euthanasias.
